

Mae Ysgol Bro Hyddgen yn ysgol 4 – 18 oed, newydd ei sefydlu, o ryw 485 o ddisgyblion wedi ei leoli ar ddau safle ar gyrion tref Machynlleth. Mae canran uchel o'r disgyblion yn byw yn y dref ac y mae'r lleill yn dod o gefndir gwledig. Rydym yn derbyn disgyblion o dair sir: Powys, Gwynedd a Cheredigion. Mae'r dalgylch ym Mhowys yn ymestyn mor bell â Charno yn y dwyrain ac Aberangell yn y gogledd-ddwyrain. Awdurdod Addysg Powys sy'n gyfrifol am yr ysgol ond y mae trefniadau hefyd i dderbyn disgyblion o Wynedd a Cheredigion.

Safle

Mae tir yr ysgol yn ddeniadol ac mae meysydd chwarae yr ysgol uwchradd wrth law adeilad yr ysgol. Er bod gennym gampfa braf yn yr ysgol, rydym hefyd yn cael defnyddio'r cyfleusterau sydd yn y Ganolfan Hamdden gerllaw'r ysgol. Mae lloches i feiciau ar gyfer y disgyblion sy'n beicio i'r ysgol. Agorwyd Canolfan Astudio Hyddgen yn mis Ionawr 2009. Mae'r adeilad yn adnodd ardderchog sy'n cynnig amgylchedd ddysgu heb ei hail i blant yr ysgol.



Our School

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Welcome

Ysgol Bro Hyddgen is a newly established 4 – 18 school of around 485 pupils, situated on two sites at the edges of the town. Although a large percentage of the pupils live in the town, a significant number come from a more rural background. We receive pupils from three counties: Powys, Gwynedd and Ceredigion. The Powys section of the catchment area extends as far east as Carno and to Aberangell in the north-east. The school is run by Powys Education Authority but arrangements are made for extra-district pupils from Gwynedd and Ceredigion.

The School Site

The school grounds are attractive and the secondary schools playing fields are adjacent to the school and in excellent condition. Although we have a recently refurbished gymnasium, the school also makes use of the facilities available in the nearby Leisure Centre. There is a cycle shelter for pupils who cycle to school. The Hyddgen Centre opened in January 2009 and is a wonderful building which provides pupils with a state of the art learning environment.

08 Cwricwlwm

Mae Ysgol Bro Hyddgen yn darparu ystod lawn o gyrsiau uwchradd i safon TGAU, UG (Uwch Gyfranno) ac Uwch (Safon A). Rydym hefyd yn darparu nifer o gyrsiau galwedigaethol er mwyn cyrraedd mesur Llywodraeth Cynulliad Cymru o gael dewis 30 o bynciau safon uwch gydag o leiaf 5 o'r rhain yn bynciau galwedigaethol (BTEC neu OCR Cenedlaethol).

Mae mwyafrif yr addysg yn yr ysgolion cynradd yn Gymraeg ei natur ac mae Ysgol Bro Hyddgen yn dilyn y patrwm hwn.

Cyfnod Allweddol 3: Blynnyddoedd 7, 8 a 9

Mae'r ysgol yn darparu cwricwlwm sy'n creu cydbwysedd rhwng yr 11 maes y cyfeirir atynt yn y Cwricwlwm Cenedlaethol a hefyd elfennau trawsgwricwlaidd megis Addysg Bersonol a Chymdeithasol a Thechnoleg Gwybodaeth.

Mae cefnogaeth ychwanegol ar gael i ddisgyblion gydag anawsterau dysgu.

Rhoddir ffocws arbennig ar ddatblygu a gwella sgiliau llythrennedd a rhif y disgyblion. Ymhyfrydw yn y ffaith ein bod ni yn Ysgol Bro Hyddgen wedi bod yn flaengar iawn wrth ymroi mor frwdfrydig i ofynion y Fframwaith Llythrennedd a Rhif Genedlaethol ac yn wir i arwain y ffordd yng nghanolbarth Cymru yn y maes hwn. Ein bwriad ymhob agwedd o'n gwaith yw rhoi'r cyfle i'r disgyblion fod â'r medrau i'w galluogi i wireddu eu breuddwydion yn ystod yr 21ain ganrif.

Cyfnod Allweddol 4: Blynnyddoedd 10 ac 11

Mae Cymraeg, Saesneg, Mathemateg a Gwyddoniaeth yn bynciau statudol yn ysgolion Cymru.

Mae'r disgyblion yn gwneud eu dewis eu hunain o dri phwnc TGAU ar gyfer gweddill y cwricwlwm. Yn ogystal â phynciau'r Cwricwlwm Cenedlaethol, rydym hefyd yn cynnig cyrsiau TGAU mewn Astudiaethau Crefyddol, Astudiaethau Busnes, Drama, Technoleg Gwybodaeth ac Addysg Gorfforol.

Rydym yn arloesi drwy ddysgu cwrs BTEC (cyfwerth â 2 bwnc TGAU) mewn Amaethyddiaeth. Mae hyn yn adlewyrchu

natur yr ardal ac yn rhoi cyfle gwych i bobl ifanc gael mynediad i gyrsiau Prifysgol megis Amaeth neu Rheolaeth Cefn Gwlad.

Ynghyd â hyn oll mae disgyblion Blynnyddoedd 10 ac 11 yn astudio ar gyfer cymhwyster Canolradd Bagloriaeth Cymru.

Rydym yn cydweithio â sefydliadau Addysg Bellach i gynnig opsiwn galwedigaethol, megis Harddwch a Thrin Gwallt, Adeiladwaith a Thrin Ceir.

Mae gan yr ysgol hon ymrwymiad i roi cyfle cyfartal i bob disgybl.

Cyfnod Allweddol 5: Blynnyddoedd 12 ac 13

Ers mis Medi 2011 mae mwy o ddewis ar gael i'r Chweched Dosbarth gyda'r ysgol yn gweithio mewn partneriaethau â darparwyr eraill. Rydym wedi sefydlu partneriaeth gydag Ysgolion Penweddig a Llanidloes a Choleg Meirion Dwyfor er mwyn cynnig cyrsiau BTEC Amaethyddiaeth, Biolwg, Electroneg, Gwleidyddiaeth, Iechyd a Gofal, Cymdeithaseg ac Addysg Awyr Agored. Mae'r myfyrwyr hefyd yn astudio ar gyfer cymhwyster Bagloriaeth Cymru , rwan sy'n gymhwyster cydnabyddedig gwerth ei gael.



Curriculum

Ysgol Bro Hyddgen provides the full range of secondary courses up to GCSE, AS and A levels. We also provide a number of vocational courses in order to reach the Welsh Assembly Government measure of offering 30 advance level subjects with at least 5 of these being vocational subjects (BTEC or OCR Nationals).

The majority of primary schools are predominantly Welsh in linguistic character and the pattern is continued in Ysgol Bro Hyddgen.

Key Stage 3: Years 7, 8 & 9

The school offers a curriculum which creates a balance between the 11 curricular areas referred to in the National Curriculum and cross curricular elements such as Personal and Social Education and IT. Particular focus is placed on developing and improving the pupils' literacy and numeracy skills. At Ysgol Bro Hyddgen, we have been innovative in adapting the curriculum to meet with the National Literacy & Numeracy Framework requirements and we are proud to be seen to be leading the way in mid Wales in this field. Our intention in every aspect of our work is to equip the pupils with the required skills to enable them to realize their dreams in the 21st century.

Key Stage 4: Years 10 & 11

Welsh, English, Mathematics and Science are compulsory for all pupils in Wales. Individual arrangements are made for pupils from outside Wales who arrive late in Years 10 or 11.

The rest of the curriculum is made up of pupils' choice of 3 GCSE subjects. In addition to the National Curriculum subjects, we also offer GCSE Religious Studies, Business Studies, Drama, IT and Physical Education.

We also provide a BTEC course in Agriculture (which is equivalent to 2 GCSE's). This course reflects the rural nature of the area and provides an excellent opportunity for our young people to move on to Agricultural and Countryside Management courses at University.

Alongside the above, Year 10 & 11 pupils also study for the Welsh Baccalaureate Intermediate Qualification.

We collaborate with Further Education establishments to offer vocational choices such as Construction, Car Mechanics, Beauty and Hairdressing.

The school is committed to providing all pupils with equal opportunities.

Key Stage 5: Years 12 & 13

Since September 2011 there has been a wider choice available to Sixth Form students with the school working in partnership with other providers. We have established a partnership with Ysgol Penweddig, Ysgol Llanidloes and Coleg Meirion Dwyfor in order to offer BTEC courses in Agriculture, Biology, Electronics, Politics, Health & Social, Sociology and Outdoor Activity Education. The students also study for the Welsh Baccalaureate Higher Qualification, which is a nationally recognised qualification.

Mae cydweithrediad rhwng yr ysgol â'r cartref yn sicrhau amser hapus a llwyddiannus i'ch plentyn yn Ysgol Bro Hyddgen. Mae'r Llyfr Cyswllt yn fod i chi anfon neges at y Tiwtor Dosbarth a chadw llygad ar gynnydd eich plentyn. Mae croeso i chi gysylltu â'r ysgol unrhyw amser.

Gwaith Cartref

Mae cwblhau gwaith cartref yn un o'r ffactorau sy'n gallu lleihau'r gwahaniaeth rhwng y plant sy'n llwyddo â'r plant sy'n tangyflawni. Mae angen cwblhau'r gwaith yn daclus a'i gyflwyno'n brydlon. Mae angen rhoi digon o amser i wneud y gwaith yn iawn.

Er mwyn rhoi'r cyfle gorau i bob plentyn wneud cynnydd, mae gennym Glwb Gwaith Cartref. Yn y fan hon rydym yn gallu rhoi help i ddisgyblion sydd heb orffen y gwaith gartref neu sydd angen help gyda rhai tasgau. Mae Cymorth yddion Cefnogi Dysgu profiadol yn cynnal y Clwb Gwaith Cartref yn y Llyfrgell ac yn yr ystafell gyfrifiaduron. Mae ar agor o 8.30 y bore, yn ystod yr awr ginio a than 4.30 y pnawn ac mae croeso cynnes i bob disgybl.

Dylai disgybl nodi'r dasg Gwaith Cartref yn y Llyfr Cyswllt a'r dyddiad ar gyfer ei gyflwyno i'r athro. Gofynnwn i rieni

arwyddo'r Llyfr Cyswllt bob wythnos. Gofynnwn hefyd i rieni ofalu bod gan y plentyn le tawel, addas i wneud y gwaith cartref a bod y gwaith yn cael ei wneud yn daclus hyd eithaf gallu'r plentyn. Mae trefniadau a thasgau arbennig ar gael i ddisgyblion gydag anawsterau dysgu.

Asesu

Mae'r broses asesu yn cychwyn gyda'r wybodaeth a dderbynir am lwyddiant, cyrhaeddiad ac anghenion eich plentyn pan fydd yn trosglwyddo o'r cynradd. Yn Ysgol Bro Hyddgen defnyddir nifer o dechnegau asesu i brofi'r sgiliau a'r medrau sydd gan y disgybl, yn amrywio o brofion ysgrifenedig a llafar i waith cwrs a hunan asesu. Ceir darlun llawn o'ch plentyn allan o hyn oll.

Bydd cysylltiad ffurfiol gyda rhieni bob tymor ar ffurf naill ai adroddiad llawn, adroddiad interim neu Noson Rhieni. Bydd yr adroddiad llawn yn cynnwys crynodeb o bresenoldeb eich plentyn yn ystod y flwyddyn a'i ddatblygiad personol (e.e. sylwadau ar ymddygiad a chyfraniad i fywyd yr ysgol) yn ogystal ag adroddiadau pynciol. Bydd yr adroddiad interim yn eich hysbysu am ymdrech a chyrhaeddiad eich plentyn. Darperir adroddiad ar Waith Cartref hefyd yn ystod Cyfnod Allweddol 3.



School and Home

How Parents Can Help

Parents and carers are expected to help their children's education by sending their children to school on time and dressed in their school uniform. Their children should keep to the statutory hours that children are allowed to work outside school hours, and parents should acquire a licence from the Area Education Office at Newtown if pupils do paid work. It is hoped that parents will support their children when they go on educational visits.

Parents and guardians are invited to the Parents/Governors' annual meeting during the Autumn Term and we would very much like to see you at the Parents' Evenings where you have the opportunity to discuss your child's progress with the teachers.

Co-operation between the home and the school ensures a happy and successful career at Ysgol Bro Hyddgen. The Contact Book encourages parents to write to the Form Tutor and allows you to monitor your child's progress. You are welcome to contact the school whenever the need arises.

Homework

Completing Homework is one of the major factors in narrowing the gap between children who succeed and those who underachieve. Homework should be given due time and attention and should be presented neatly and on time.

In order to maximise the opportunities for every child to make progress, we have established Homework Clubs. Here we can help pupils who have not been able to complete work at home or who need help with particular questions. The Club is staffed by experienced Learning Support Assistants in the Library and in a Computer Room. It is open at 8.30 in the morning, during the Lunch Hour and until 4.30 p.m. after school. All pupils are welcome to attend.

Pupils should note the Homework task in their Contact Book as well as the date the task is due in. Parents are asked to sign the Contact Book every week. We also ask parents to support the child by providing him/her with a quiet, suitable place to complete homework, and by ensuring that all tasks are presented neatly and are done to

the best of the child's ability. When a child has special needs, special arrangements will be made to ensure the tasks are within their capability.

Assessment

Assessment starts with the information we receive about the successes, the achievements and the needs of your child when he/she transfers from the primary school. In Ysgol Bro Hyddgen many assessment techniques are used to prove the skills and accomplishments of pupils: we look at written, practical, oral work, coursework, tests, examinations, observation and self-assessment. This gives a rounded picture of your child.

There will be formal contact with parents once every term: a full report, an interim report, or a Parents' Evening. The full report will include a summary of the pupil's attendance, personal development (e.g. comments on behaviour and contribution to school life) as well as subject reports. The interim report will keep you informed about effort and attainment. At Key Stage 3, a homework report is also provided.

12 Ymddygiad

Mae gan Ysgol Bro Hyddgen ddisgwyliadau uchel o ran ymddygiad da. Rydym yn disgwyl i bob disgylion ymddwlyn yn dda a gweithio'n galed. Disgyblaeth Bositif

Er mwyn meithrin a chynnal ymddygiad da, mae'r ysgol wedi buddsoddi mewn system gyfrifiadurol soffistigedig ar gyfer cofnodi ymddygiad da a drwg. Os bydd y disgylion yn ymddwlyn yn dda, bydd rhieni yn derbyn negeseuon testun a'ch plant yn derbyn tystysgrifau a gwobrau eraill.

Os bydd disgyl yn camymddwlyn, bydd hynny yn cael ei gofnodi'n electroneg a chaiff neges destun ei hanfon adref, ac efallai bydd angen trefnu cyfweliad i drafod yr ymddygiad a sut y gallwn helpu'r disgyl wella. Gall cosb gynnwys aros i mewn yn ystod amser egwyl neu amser cinio, neu ar ôl ysgol (rhoddir o leiaf 24 awr o rybudd os bydd hyn digwydd). Mae'n bosib y caiff y plentyn ei roi ar adroddiad.

Pe digwydd i ddisgyl barhau i ymddwlyn yn wael neu i wneud

rhywbeth difrifol, gallai gael ei atal o wersi neu o'r ysgol am gyfnod o amser. Mae hawl gan yr ysgol i wahardd disgyl am 45 diwrnod mewn blwyddyn. Os bydd disgyl yn cael ei wahardd am fwy na 5 diwrnod, mae panel y Bwrdd Llywodraethol yn cyfarfod i ystyried y gwaharddiad. Os bydd y disgyl yn cael ei wahardd yn barhaol, yna mae'n rhaid i'r penderfyniad gael ei gadarnhau gan baner y Corff Llywodraethol, a'i dderbyn neu ei newid. Os yw rhiant / ofalwr yn dymuno apelio yn erbyn unrhyw benderfyniad ynglŷn â gwaharddiad a wnaed gan yr ysgol, yna dylid gwneud hyn yn ysgrifenedig i Gadeirydd y Corff Llywodraethwyr a'r Cyfarwyddwr Addysg.

Mae'r ysgol yn sefyll yn gruf yn erbyn bwlio. Anogir pob disgyl i ddweud wrth ei Diwtor Dosbarth (neu unrhyw aelod o'r staff) am unrhyw ddigwyddiad ac mae 2 flocs postio ar gael i alluogi'r disgyl roi neges gyfrinachol (wedi ei arwyddo) ynglŷn ag unrhyw beth sy'n ei boeni.

Ni chaniateir i ddisgylion Blynnyddoedd 7 - 11adael tir yr ysgol ar unrhyw adeg. Ar gais ysgrifenedig rhieni, gall disgylion Blwyddyn 11 fynd i'r dref amser cinio (mae hyn yn amodol ar ymddygiad da yn yr ysgol a thu allan). Caniateir i fyfyrwyr Blynnyddoedd 12 & 13adael tir yr ysgol amser cinio. Dylai ffonau symudol gal eu cadw ar "silent" yn ystod gwersi. Dylai eitemau gwerthfawr gael eu cadw'n ddiogel yn y Swyddfa.



Behaviour

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Ysgol Bro Hyddgen has high expectations of good behaviour. All pupils are expected to work hard and to behave well. Staff treat pupils with courtesy and expect courtesy in return. Pupils are expected to treat each other with respect. Those who behave particularly well are rewarded.

Code of behaviour at Ysgol Bro Hyddgen

- Treat others as you would like to be treated by them.
- When you speak to each other, to teachers and to visitors, use language that is appropriate.
- Show respect for other people, for your school work, for your property and the property of others.
- Listen to teachers and to each other.
- Co-operate with your teachers.
- Learn to work together.
- Move about the school in an orderly way.
- Arrive promptly and be ready for lessons with books and equipment.
- Take pride in the appearance of the school.
- Work hard at all times.

Positive Discipline

In order to encourage and sustain good behaviour, the school has invested in a highly sophisticated computer system for recording and collating good and bad behaviour. In the case of good behaviour, this will lead to parents receiving letters of commendation, and pupils will be given certificates and other rewards.

In the case of bad behaviour, the computer triggers a sequence of events beginning with a letter and continuing with an invitation to attend a meeting to discuss the problem and how best to help the pupil mend his/her ways. Sanctions include break or lunch-time detention, being placed 'on report' or after school detention (parents will be given 24 hours' notice of this)

If a pupil persistently misbehaves or his/her behaviour is particularly unacceptable, he/she will be suspended from lessons or from school for a period of time. The school has the right to suspend pupils for

45 school days a year. If a pupil is suspended for more than 5 days, a Governing Body panel meets to consider the suspension. If a pupil is to be expelled permanently, then this decision is discussed by a Governors' Panel and will be either confirmed or changed. There is a right of appeal which should be made in writing to the Chairperson of the Governing Body and the Director of Education.

The school makes a strong stand against bullying. All pupils are encouraged to tell tutors (or any member of staff) about any incident. Two post boxes are placed in the school for any child to write a (signed) note in confidence to the Headteacher about anything which is upsetting them.

Year 7- 11 pupils are not allowed to leave the school grounds at any time; Year 11 pupils are allowed to go into town during the lunch break if permitted by parents (this privilege depends on good behaviour at school and outside); Years 12 & 13 are allowed to leave the school at lunch time. Mobile phones should be set at 'silent' during lessons. Items of value should be given in at the Office where they will be stored in a safe.

Mae aelodau o'r staff yn canfod yr Anghenion Arbennig ar gyfer y disgybl. Mae Cynllun Addysg Unigol yn cael ei baratoi ar gyfer y disgybl gan y Cyd-gysylltydd Anghenion Arbennig, Mr Iwan Biffin. Gall hyn olygu fod y disgybl yn derbyn sylw o fewn grŵp bychan ac yn ystod cyfnod di-wers.

Gweithredu gan yr ysgol + mwy

Polisi Iaith

Pastoral

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Pastoral Care

The following members of staff implement and manage pastoral care:

- Mr Tegid Owen: Years 7, 8, 9 and Transition
- Miss Dela Wyn Jones: Years 10 and 11
- Mr Llifon Ellis: Years 12 and 13

This overview brings together all aspects of your child's development and is part of our caring atmosphere.

A brief daily period is held when the pupil's Form Tutor is able to monitor progress and get to know the individual members of the Form. If a problem occurs in the pupil's school life, this is a good opportunity to discuss the matter and receive advice. During the school year the Registration Tutor will also interview each pupil individually.

Special Educational Needs

The school's Special needs Policy is based on the LEA Policy and the school's interpretation of the Special Educational Needs Code of Practice, 2002.

The 3 statutory classifications of SEN are interpreted as follows:

School Action

Teachers identify needs. Individual Educational Plans (IEPs) are prepared by the ALN Co-ordinator, Mr Iwan Biffin. This may mean that the pupil will be given special attention within a small group during non-teaching periods.

School Action +

Pupils continue to experience problems. IEP is reviewed by the SENCO. Further advice may be required e.g. speech therapist. The Local Authority may provide for additional support within the classroom or for 1 or 2 hours' individual attention every week according to the need.

Statement

A formal statement listing needs and provision is prepared by the Educational Psychologist for pupils with more complex problems who may need the support of a Learning Support Assistant for longer periods of the school day.

Pupils' special needs are usually identified in the primary schools but they may be recognised later as physical, behavioural or social conditions become more apparent.

The ground floor is accessible to pupils with physical disabilities. All except three classrooms are on the ground floor and adjustments can be made to allocation of rooms if necessary so that the full curriculum can be taught to all pupils.

In its Accessibility Plan, The Governing Body intends to provide specialist aids when required for visual or hearing impaired pupils and visitors to the school.

Language Policy

The school has a particularly successful language policy which allows pupils to develop their full potential. Our aim is to help pupils to be as articulate and fully bilingual as possible by the time they leave school. This policy is a progression from the local primary schools' excellent achievements and is a reflection of the Powys Education Authority language strategy for this locality. We are fully aware of the cognitive and educational benefits of bilingualism and we aim to develop the abilities of our pupils in both languages. All departments are aware of their role in developing the linguistic skills of their pupils and teachers are sensitive to the linguistic capabilities of each pupil.

Addysg Rhyw

Cred y Corff Llywodraethol y dylai addysg rhyw fod yn rhan allweddol a chreiddiol o gwricwlwm pob disgylion i roi'r ystyriaeth briodol i'r agweddau moesol a gwerth bywyd teulual. Darperir hyn drwy gyfrwng adnoddau APAUSE (Added Power & Understanding in Sex education) o dan arweiniad y Nyrs Ysgol.

Mae hawl gan riant i eithrio'r plentyn o Addysg Rhyw, ar wahân i'r agweddau rheini sydd yn rhan o'r Cwricwlwm Cenedlaethol. Pe dymunir gwneud hyn, rhaid ysgrifennu at y Pennaeth i'r perwyl hwn. Mae croeso i rieni drafod y mater gyda'r Pennaeth os oes ansicrwydd ynglŷn â phriodoldeb y cyflwyno.

Cysylltu â'r Cartref

Mae'r ysgol yn cysylltu â rhieni drwy anfon negeseuon testun os yw eich plentyn wedi cyflawni gwaith rhagorol, heb gwblhau gwaith cartref, heb offer (bag, llyfrau, a.y.y.b) neu yn cyrraedd yr ysgol yn hwyr. Bydd Mrs Davinia Brown yn ffonio rhieni ar fore'r diwrnod cyntaf o absenoldeb i gael eglurhad am yr absenoldeb.

Mae Mrs Waters yn gorfod llenwi llyfr log dyddiol ac yn trafod absenoldebau bob wythnos gyda'r Swyddog Lles.

Addysg Gyrfaoedd / Cyswllt Diwydiant a Busnes

Mae cysylltiadau â'r byd gwaith, busnes a diwydiant yn bwysig. Cynigir Addysg Gyrfaoedd fel rhan o'r rhaglen Addysg Bersonol a Chymdeithasol a'r Fagloraeth Gymraeg.

Ym Mlwyddyn 9 cynghorir rhieni a disgylion i wneud penderfyniadau call ynglŷn â dewis pynciau. Ac mae cyfle ymestynnol i ddatblygu ymwybyddiaeth o fusnes.

Ym Mlynnyddoedd 10 ac 11 sicrheir bod pob disgylion yn derbyn cyngor arbenigol gan aelod o Gyfra Cymru. Bob dwy flynedd cynhelir Confensiwn Gyrfaoedd pan gaiff cyflogwyr lleol drafod cyfleoedd gwaith yn yr ardal.

Yn y Chweched Dosbarth mae cyfle gan y myfyrwyr i gael mynediad at gyngor gyrfaoedd a chyfleoedd Addysg Uwch. Mae gweithgareddau menter yn cael eu hybu yn y Chweched.

Mae'r ysgol yn gweithio'n agos gyda Gyfra Cymru ac mae'r swyddog lleol yn darparu gwasanaeth a chyfarwyddyd gyrfaoedd arbenigol a diduedd. Ein nod yw helpu pobl ifanc drosglwyddo yn esmwyth o fyd addysg i waith neu addysg bellach.

Gwahoddir disgylion Blwyddyn 11 i Ddiwrnod Agored mewn sefydliadau Addysg Bellach neu Goleg trydyddol. Mae darpariaeth dda ar gyfer disgylion gydag Anghenion Addysgol Arbennig.



Pastoral

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Religious Education

The law stipulates that the school must provide statutory religious education of a broadly non-denominational nature, but including references to other religions. It should reflect the Christian ethos of the country.

Each day begins with a religious service either in the school hall or in the Form Room. Parents have the right to withdraw their children from religious education or from assembly. Please contact the Headteacher for further details.

Sex Education

The Governing Body believes that sex education should be an integral and core part of each pupil's curriculum, and the way in which it is presented encourages children to give proper consideration to moral issues and the value of family life.

This is achieved through the APAUSE (Added Power & Understanding in Sex Education) programme which is delivered under the guidance of the School Nurse.

Parents have the right to withdraw their children from formal sex education lessons, (except those which form part of the National Curriculum). If they wish to do so then they should inform the Headteacher in writing. They are welcome to discuss the matter with the Headteacher if they have any doubt about the suitability of presenting sex education to their children.

Contacting the Home

The school will send out a text to parents if a child has achieved excellent work, not completed homework, has no equipment (bag, books etc) or arriving late for school. Mrs Davinia Brown will ring parents on the first day of absence to get a reason for the child being absent.

Mrs Wates has to fill in a daily log for absence and then has a meeting to discuss absenteeism with the Education Welfare Officer one a week.

Careers Education / Links with Industry and Business

Relations with industry, business and the world of work are important. Careers education is part of the Personal and Social Education programme and is also an integral part of the Welsh Baccalaureate Qualification at Intermediate & Higher level.

In Year 9 pupils and their parents are encouraged to make sensible subject choices and are given an extended opportunity to develop a sense of business.

In Years 10 and 11 pupils receive careers advice from a staff member of Careers Wales. Every two years Careers Conventions are held when local employers are given the opportunity to discuss local employment options.

In the Sixth Form students have access to advice on careers and Higher Education opportunities;

The school works closely with Careers Wales and their local officer provides impartial, specialist careers guidance and information. The aim is to help young people make a successful transition from education to further or higher education or to suitable work.

Year 11 pupils are invited to Open Days at local Further Education or tertiary Colleges. Good provision is available for students with special educational needs.

Yn ystod y flwyddyn mae corau'r ysgol yn perfformio i gymdeithasau lleol. Rydym yn cystadlu mewn eisteddfodau lleol ac rydym yn hynod o falch o llwyddiannau'r ysgol yn Eisteddfod Genedlaethol yr Urdd dros nifer o flynyddoedd.

Daw cwmnïau theatr ac S4C yn fynych i'r ysgol efo'u sioeau ac rydym yn cefnogi gwaith Ysgol Theatr Maldwyn.

The local business community is particularly supportive of the school and we have good links with movements such as Forest Schools, Powys Training and the Youth Service, Y Blewyn Glas, Merched y Wawr and local churches and chapels.

The school works in close co-operation with the Police and with the Local Health Services.

During the year choirs sing for local societies. We take part in local and Urdd Eisteddfod events and the school has been very successful over the years at the National Urdd Eisteddfod.

Theatre in Education productions and S4C performances are regularly staged at the school.

Clubs and Extracurricular Activities

The school is noted for its charity work: pupils raise many hundreds of pounds for good causes; at the same time pupils learn many skills through finding ways of helping those less fortunate than themselves.

During the year many educational courses and trips are organised by different departments e.g. lectures, field trips, theatre visits. The Governors also permit departments to take pupils abroad on educational and sporting trips. The school also welcomes groups which provide workshops and drama or musical productions.

The school has been particularly successful in art and sporting competitions as well as Urdd National Eisteddfod singing and dancing competitions. Talented individuals have gone far in

Sports and have even represented their country.

Gwersi Offerynnol a Llais

Mae'r ysgol yn trefnu athrawon cerdd teithiol sydd yn cefnogi gwaith yr Adran gerdd. Cynigir gwersi telyn, gitâr, chwythbrennau, drymiau, pres a llais. Mae rhieni'n gwneud cyfraniad ariannol tuag at y gwersi hyn sy'n digwydd yn ystod y diwrnod ysgol.

Lluniaeth

Darperir lluniaeth ysgafn amser egwyl a phrydau bwyd amser cinio yn y ffreutur ble caiff y disgublioni wneud eu dewis eu hunain a thalu wrth y ddesg. Awgrymwn fod angen tua £3.25 y dydd i brynu digon o fwyd. Er, mi fydd hyn am newid yn y dyfodol gan fod system electronig heb arian am gael ei gyflwyno yn y dyfodol agos ble fydd olion bysedd neu cerdyn yn cael ei ddefnyddio i brynnu bwyd. Mae bwydydd iach a bwyd llysieuol a ffrwythau ar gael bob dydd. Mae rhai disgublioni yn gallu cael bwyd am ddim a dylied gwneud cais yn fuan yng ngwyliau'r Haf, neu pan fo amgylchiadau teuluol yn newid i'r Swyddfa Addysg Fro, Yr Hen Goleg, Y Drenewydd.

Rydym yn annog disgublioni i ddod â photeli dŵr i'r ysgol ac i yfed digon ar hyd y dydd, gan gynnwys yfed dŵr mewn gwersi, heb law am y labordai gwyliau! Mae ffynhonnau dŵr ar gael yn yr ysgol.

Presenoldeb

Mae presenoldeb yn flaenoriaeth genedlaethol a lleol yng Nghymru. Mae'r chwe Chyfarwyddwr o fewn consortiw ERW, sy'n cynnwys Powys eisoes wedi gwneud y penderfyniad y dylai pob absenoldeb sy'n deillio o gymryd gwyliau yn ystod y tymor gaet ei ystyried fel absenoldeb anawdurdodedig. Mae'r cysylltiad rhwng presenoldeb da a safonau uchel yn un cryf iawn ac fel y cyfryw, mae'r Cyfarwyddwyr yn awyddus i annog cyfraddau presenoldeb uchel ac i annog rhieni i beidio â chymryd gwyliau yn ystod y tymor. Felly er mis Medi 2013 ni fydd unrhyw bennaeth o fewn y chwe Awdurdod Lleol yn y consortiw awdurdodi absenoldebau oherwydd gwyliau.

Mae cymryd gwyliau yn ystod y tymor yn golygu bod plant yn colli amser pwysig yn yr ysgol, yn addysgol ac o ran gweithgareddau ysgol eraill. Mae'n anodd iawn i ddisgyblion ddat i fyny ar y gwaith y maent wedi'i golli. Mewn diwrnod ysgol prysur, mae'n anodd i ysgolion ddod o hyd i'r amser ychwanegol i helpu plentyn i ddat i fyny. Gall absenoldebau cyson effeithio'n andwyol ar gynnydd academaidd; gall hefyd effeithio ar les cymdeithasol ac emosiynol plentyn. Ceir digon o ymchwil addysgol sy'n cysylltu cyrhaeddiaid

disgyblion â phresenoldeb. Mae cyfradd presenoldeb o 90% yn yr ysgol yn cyfateb i goll ½ diwrnod yr wythnos. Byddai hyn yn golygu colli 4 wythnos gyfan yn ystod y flwyddyn ysgol!

Os ydy plentyn yn absennol, gofynnwn yn garedig i rieni ffonio'r ysgol i roi gwybod i ni rhwng 8.00 â 9.00 y bore. Mae'n bwysig eich bod yn gwneud hyn gan y bu achosion trasig mewn rhai ardaloedd o'r wlad oherwydd diffyg cyfathrebu rhwng yr ysgol a'r rhieni. Gwelwch felly ei bod yn bwysig bod gennym ffordd i gysylltu â chi bob amser a diolchwn i chi am ein hysbysu o rifau ffôn perthnasol. Rydym yn gwneud ein gorau i gysylltu â chi os nad oes eglurhad wedi cyraedd am absenoldeb ac rydym yn cofrestru'r disgublioni ym mhob gwers. Ond mae'n rhaid i ni bwysleisiau mai cyfrifoldeb y rhiant yw sicrhau bod y plentyn yn yr ysgol. Os yw plentyn yn absennol yn fwy aml na phlant eraill bydd y Swyddog Lles Addysg, sydd yn galw yn yr ysgol yn wythnosol, yn gwneud ymholaidd a gall alw yn y cartref. O fis Tachwedd 2014 ymlaen gall Awdurdod Addysg Powys weinyddu dirwy ar rieni os yw presenoldeb eu plentyn yn syrthio o dan 90% neu os yw plentyn yn absennol heb ganiatâd am 5 diwrnod mewn cyfnod o 12 wythnos.

Plentyn yn absennol oherwydd salwch (neu unrhyw reswm digonol arall), nodwch y rhewsm mewn llythyr os gwellwch yn dda ar ddiwrnod cyntaf y plentyn nôl yn yr ysgol; mae'n ofynnol i ni gadw'r eglurhad ysgrifenedig yn ffeil y disgublioni.

Diolch i bob rhiant sydd yn rhoi gwybod i ni am absenoldeb ac yn anfon llythyr o eglurhad am absenoldeb diliys.

Information

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School Council

The school has a well-established School Council, with an elected representative from each Tutor group. The opinions expressed in the School Council are always listened to by senior members of staff and sometimes passed on to the Governing Body. We are pleased that pupils make a positive contribution to the running of what is fundamentally their school.

Instrumental and Voice tuition

The school organizes peripatetic music teachers who offer a support service to the Music department. Harp, guitar, woodwind, brass, drums and voice tuition is offered. Parents make financial contributions towards these lessons which are held during the school day.

Refreshments

School dinner and break time snacks are provided in the canteen. Dinner is provided through a snack bar system with pupils choosing for themselves and paying at the desk. We suggest that a pupil needs approximately £3.25per day. However, this will change in the near future, with a 'cashless' electronic system being introduced, where pupils will use fingerprints or a card to purchase food. Healthy options, vegetarian meals and fruit are available daily. Free meals are available in special cases and applications should be made early in the summer holidays or whenever family circumstances change, to the Area Education Office, Old College, Newtown. Pupils should bring drinking water to school in plastic bottles. They are encouraged to drink water throughout the day, including in lessons, except for the science labs. Water fountains are placed in the school.

Transport

School buses collect pupils from the district to attend school and the pupils are supervised on arriving and leaving the premises. This service is provided by Powys Education Authority and a good standard of behaviour is expected at all times on the bus to ensure the safety of the passengers and the driver.

When transport is required to attend an educational activity, parents/guardians are asked to contribute towards the cost.

Attendance

Attendance is a national and local priority in Wales. The six directors within the South West and Mid Wales Education Consortium, which includes Powys have already taken the decision that all absences due to pupils going on holiday during term time should be deemed to be unauthorised..

The link between good attendance and high standards is a very strong one and as such, the Directors are eager to encourage high attendance rates and to discourage holidays being taken during term time. Therefore since September 2013 it has been decided that all absences due to holidays should not be authorised by any Headteachers within the six Local Authorities in the South West and Mid Wales Consortium.

Taking a holiday during term time means that children miss important school time which can impact on their education and other extracurricular activities. It will be difficult for them to catch up on work they have missed. In a busy school day, it is difficult for schools to find the extra time to help a child

catch up. Continued absences can have a detrimental effect on a child's academic work; it can also effect a child's social and emotional wellbeing. There is plenty of educational research which links pupil attainment with attendance. 90% attendance at school equates to $\frac{1}{2}$ day a week missed. This would be 4 whole weeks missed over the school year!

If a child is absent, we ask parents to contact the school between 8.00 - 9.00 a.m. with an explanation. This is important as there have been tragic consequences in other areas because of a lack of communication between parents and school. It is essential therefore that we have the correct telephone numbers so that we can contact you at various times of the day. We endeavour to contact parents if no explanation has been given for an absence and we register pupils in every lesson. But we must emphasise that it is the parents' responsibility to ensure that their child is at school. If a child's attendance is a cause for concern, the Education Welfare Officer, who visits the school weekly, will make investigations and visit the home. From November 2014 Powys Education Authority may issue on the spot fines if a child's attendance falls below 90% or if a child is absent from school without permission for 5 days over a period of 12 weeks.

If a child is absent due to illness (or for any other reason), a letter should be sent explaining the absence on the first day he/she returns; we are required to keep this written explanation in the pupil's file.

We thank all parents who inform us promptly of absence and who send us written explanations on the pupil's return to school.

Information

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Transport

School buses collect pupils from the district to attend school and the pupils are supervised on arriving and leaving the premises. When transport is required to attend an educational activity, parents/guardians are asked to contribute towards the cost.

Health

Feeling Ill at school

If a pupil feels unwell at school, the teacher should be told and the pupil will be taken to the medical room to be assessed by the supervisor. We will contact parents (or members of the family) so that a child who is unwell can be collected and taken home if needs be.

Accidents

We are fortunate that a number of members of our staff are trained first aiders.

If a pupil has an accident at school, the nearest first aider will treat him as appropriate or arrange for the pupil to be taken (accompanied by a member of staff) to obtain medical attention at the hospital. Parents will be notified as soon as possible. (It is important that parents provide the school with their mobile phone number.) On no account should a pupil leave school without permission.

Medicines

If you wish the school to administer your child's medicine during school hours, please send an explanatory letter and/or a medical report to the school; the medicine will be put away for safekeeping.

Parents/ carers should inform the school if a child has a medical condition which may affect him/her at school. Parents of pupils who have to take medicine on a regular basis will need to work out a written care plan with the school.

Asthmatic pupils need to keep their inhalers in their possession at all times; it is a good idea to send in a spare inhaler for us to keep in school.

Publicity

From time to time photographs of children taking part in school activities are taken. Some of these photographs may be published in the press or other publicity material. If parents do not wish for their child to be included in

publicity photographs then they should indicate so in the school Contact Book.

Right to View Documents

Please give 15 days' notice if you wish to view any relevant document.

The Right to Complain and Appeal

The headteacher receives any inquiries in cases of complaints or appeals. Please contact the school.
